Centre features	All Participants	Possible/not serious	 Establish local geography, including facilities, boundaries and non-access areas such as car parks or maintenance areas. Where necessary, mark facilities appropriately for males/female, adult/YP only etc Discourage bare feet, appropriate footwear should be worn Discourage running around the centre 	
Drinking Water: Illness from waterborne disease	All Participants	Unlikely/ Possible	 Many remote centres are not on the mains supply and use UV or carbon filtration systems. Note to participants that water may be a little discoloured but is safe. Follow any specific advise from centre/accommodation regarding drinking water If any concerns, boil all drinking water and inform participants to see the doctor if they become unwell after the event 	
Waste: Illness from infection or vermin	All Participants	Possible/ Serious	 Ensure participants know where both waste water and general waste should be disposed of Use recycling facilities if provided 	
Food Hygiene: Illness	All Participants	Possible	 Ensure the centre has suitable facilities for storing and cooking food Ensure the event caters for sufficient cleaning facilities Ensure surfaces, cooking, eating and food storage facilities are clean before and after use Capture any allergies or other dietary requirements on even application form and plan menu appropriately (if group-catering) 	
Fire: Carbon monoxide poisoning, suffocation, burns	All Participants	Possible/ Very Serious	 Observe all fire evacuation procedures provided by the centre Ensure that fire doors are unlocked (but not propped open) Note locations of extinguishers and ensure fire and CM alarms are working Ensure clear and safe egress and access to all areas is maintained at all times Clean up any spillages immediately

Cooking: Fire, carbon monoxide poisoning, burns and scalds, hot surfaces	All Participants	Possible/ Serious	 Follow all instructions provided by the centre, including extraction and ventilation. Restrict numbers allowed in the cooking area – adults only unless YP are specifically requested to help Ensure suitable first aid is readily available 	
Personal Hygiene: Illness	All Participants	Unlikely/ Possible	 Ensure centre has suitable toilets, washing and showering facilities (including for the safe disposal of feminine hygiene products) Ensure suitable supplies of personal hygiene supplies and facilities – both by the centre, event organiser and the participants (via kit list) Strongly encourage hand-washing before eating and after toileting 	
Safeguarding:	All Participants	Possible/ Serious	 Ensure that suitable sleeping and privacy arrangements are put into place No mixed rooms (unless sufficient privacy and separation can be ensured) NOTE: mixed include male/female and under 18 / over 18 Establish suitable procedures for toilet and shower facilities to avoid mixed use Ensure clear access and egress from sleeping quarters, including lighting 	
Behaviour:	All Participants	Possible	 Capture any potential behaviour issues on the application form (ADHD, Autism etc) and plan appropriately, informing party leaders Ensure safe and appropriate behaviour is observed from both adults and YPs at all times while in the centre. Inappropriate behaviour (by both adults and YPs) should be dealt with swiftly by the party and/or event leaders. Dynamic assessment required as will depend on the circumstances If the participant refuses to comply or change behaviour then consider sending them home or calling YPs parents to come and collect them. 	
Free time Straying out of bounds, getting lost, injury, poor behaviour	All Participants	Possible	 Remind participants about expect behaviour and responsibilities to others in the building Inform participants of the site boundaries Inform participants of any potential dangers on site Where applicable, set a curfew to be in bed Inform participants in which room the appropriate leader is staying in case of issues or emergencies If allowed off site, inform YPs of expected minimum group size (usually 3)
